**SUBJECT : AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM ORDER NO. 149 SERIES OF 2023
IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BPI ONLINE IDENTIFICATION CARD (ID)
GENERATOR**

In compliance to the DA Brand Guidelines dated 2023 March 28 to establish a distinct and consistent identity for Department of Agriculture (DA) employees, the BPI created an Online ID Generator to establish a secure and verifiable ID system and to organize the process of issuing ID cards. The following standards and guidelines shall apply:

Section 1. Scope. All BPI employees must apply for an ID through the official online generator system.

Section 2. Application Process. All employees must register through myid.buplant.da.gov.ph and provide all necessary information for the issuance of the IDs. Queries may be directed to their respective focal person. The system can generate both ID cards: ARTA ID (5.3"x 3.4") and PVC card ID (3.418" x 2.152").

Section. 3. Data storage. The HRS must validate the applications by cross-checking of the provided information based on the available records and approve once validated. All information shall be stored in a secure and encrypted data storage.

Section 4. Focal Persons. The focal person must guide their assigned offices, cascade the process, and assist the ICS in the implementation of the said system. The ICS must provide the accounts (username and temporary password) exclusively for their respective offices. *Attached is the list of operating units with respective username IDs, designated focal persons and the other necessary information.*

Section 5. Effectivity. This shall supersede all previous issuances inconsistent herewith. This memorandum order shall take effect starting **February 8, 2024** and shall remain in force until revoked in writing.

Section. 3. Data storage. The Personnel Section must validate the applications by cross-checking of the provided information based on the available records and the ICS must approve once validated. All information shall be stored in a secure and encrypted data storage.

Section 4. Focal Persons. The focal person must guide their assigned offices, cascade the process, and assist the ICS in the implementation of the said system. The ICS must provide the accounts (username and temporary password) exclusively for their respective offices. *Attached is the list of operating units with respective username IDs, designated focal persons and the other necessary information.*

Section 5. Effectivity. This shall supersede all previous issuances inconsistent herewith. This memorandum order shall take effect starting **May 22, 2023** and shall remain in force until revoked in writing.
